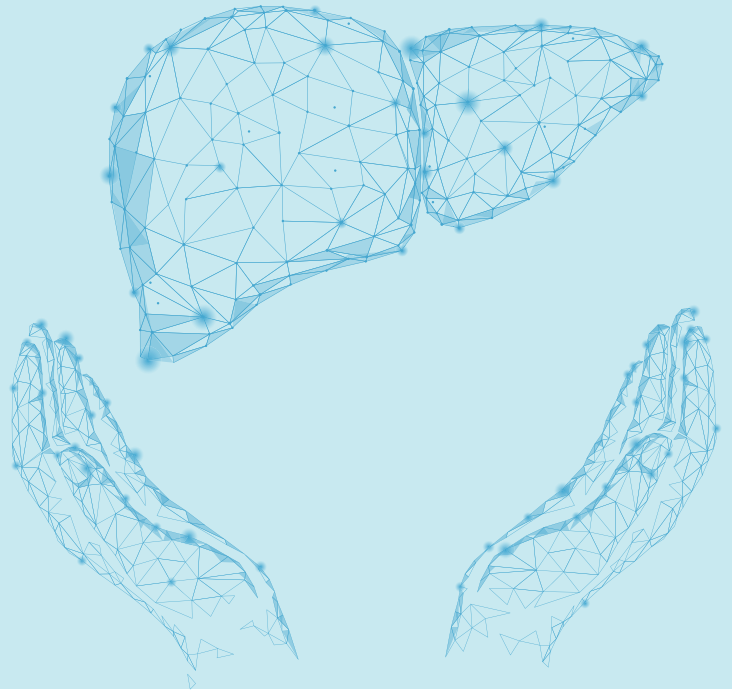

#### ABOUT THE SPEAKER

Dr. Jonathan Brody has dedicated more than two decades to studying the molecular aspects of cancer. His efforts have earned him leadership positions with the Department of Defense's Cancer Research Program and the American Cancer Society. Dr. Brody – a collaborator on several prestigious R01 and R21 National Cancer Institute and NIH grants – is continually pursuing methods to better understand and treat pancreatic cancer and related diseases. Dr. Brody has published more than 100 peer-reviewed publications in many top-tier scientific and cancer journals and has co-authored multiple book chapters and review articles on cancer. Dr. Brody was an American Cancer Society Research Scholar and won the Pancreatic Cancer Career Development Award from the American Association of Cancer Research in 2010. Currently, he is the principal investigator on a PanCAN-AACR \$1 million grant analyzing precision medicine for pancreatic cancer. We are delighted that Dr. Brody will join us to share his revolutionary contributions to the field of pancreatic, biliary, and related cancers.
